(adopted by the 1st UNI World Youth Conference, 23/24 Oct. 2004, Berlin)



## Youth organising competition

### Purpose

- UNI Youth encourages all UNI affiliates to develop organising projects around the issues of child labour and HIV/Aids.
- Projects should be aiming at the recruitment and organisation of young workers as well as to increase the active participation of young members through the issues of child labour and HIV/Aids.
- The raising of awareness, dissemination of information, research, education of union members, training of multipliers, development of trade union policies and workplace agreements etc. on the issues of child labour and HIV/Aids should be used as tools to organise more young trade unionists.
- The project must be financed by the union which is carrying it out.
- Affiliates are encouraged to develop joint projects.

### Selection process

- The UNI world youth committee is going to select the most innovative and creative project.
- The projects are not expected to be finished by June 2005 but instead should be on their way.
- The "winner" will be announced on 12 June 2005 which is The World Day Against Child Labour.

### Prize

- A representative of the "winning" project will be invited to present the project to the 2<sup>nd</sup> UNI World Congress in Chicago.

### Timeframe

- Project development should start right after the closure of the 1<sup>st</sup> UNI World Youth Conference.
- Projects have to be entered into the competition before 30 April 2005.
- The Project that will be presented at UNI's 2<sup>nd</sup> world congress in August 2005 in Chicago, USA will be announced on 12 June 2005.
